REIGNITING OUR MINISTRY

It has been a great year for Youth Ministry here at FBYC!

It has been a great joy to see so many happy faces here for Winter Camp, Nazareth Nights, and other programs. We lead three confirmation retreats bringing in 60 High School Students and 8 different speakers. We focused on the Holy Spirit who wants to help them know God and be able to do His work in their lives! At the end of one of the retreats, some students even requested another retreat so we had a prayer workshop where they learned various forms of prayer: how to pray with the Bible through Lectio Divina, pray the Rosary and spend time in Adoration.





We started Family Adoration each month. Allowing families to pray together and deepen reverence for Jesus' presence in the Blessed Sacrament. These have attracted up to 40 people and we would love to have more families join. We are taking a break for summer but families are excited to continue starting again in September.

All are welcome to join.

We hosted a winter camp for younger children with high school volunteers. The three days were filled with crafts, prayer, and everyone's favorite: Sports with monks. Finally, FBYC hosted a Vacation Bible School in Cottage Grove. Three volunteers and our youth minister went down for a week of programs based on Jesus' parables. Fr. Boyle, at the parish, offered Daily Mass and taught the kids how to pray at church and even showed them around the sacristy. It was beautiful to guide them to Jesus and a lot of fun!


